Sandcastle Waterpark (SWP) takes its environmental responsibilities seriously and is committed to minimise any adverse environmental impacts of its operations.

SWP's mission over the next 5 years is to reduce its carbon footprint by 10+% by expanding energy saving initiatives, implementing further staff training and awareness and creating an 'Environment Champion' who will drive sustainability in the business and liaise with the local community and stakeholders to develop a sustainable future.

SWP has implemented a large number of initiatives over a period of 10+ years to reduce its carbon footprint and create a sustainable visitor attraction, from its reduction of single use plastics in the waterpark by 90%, recycling of water and waste and its energy saving lighting throughout the building, to name a few

Sandcastle Waterpark is committed to:

- Continually improve its environmental performance.
- Where possible use products/services through suppliers and partners that are environmentally friendly, and local if possible thereby reducing consumables mileage e.g. food.
- Grow a committee of representatives from different departments of the business to come up with new ways to improve sustainability.
- Retain accreditation for the Green Key Award.

- Comply with relevant environmental legislation and Green Key Award Criteria.
- Educate and train staff on environmental issues and the effects of their activities.
- Monitor progress and review environmental performance against targets and objectives on a regular basis.
